The camper selection process gets harder each year as outstanding young women are nominated by their science/math teachers. Our 2010 scholarship recipients will be Andrea Lawrie from Charter Middle School, and Trevor Hovey, from Paradise Intermediate.

They will spend a week at Camp Marie Curie, on the Stanford University campus.

Thanks to everyone who has helped with Branch fund raisers and/or made individual donations. A special thanks to Connie Ferrell and Carol Holzgrafe who helped interview the nominees. Public Policy

Update on the Paycheck Fairness Act, Senate version: Sen. Dianne Feinstein has signed on as co-sponsor of the bill with Senator Barbara Boxer. Perhaps she felt it was time; perhaps she heard all those AAUW phone calls urging her to get a move on. Thank you, Senator.

Victory on Title IX:

You all know that AAUW was fundamental in the passage of Title IX, the 1972 bill that banned sex discrimination in schools. (We pack a wallop in Washington, D.C.). During the previous administration, a loophole was provided to school districts, allowing that, if a survey was taken and girls didn't seem as interested in sports (for example) as boys, the district was okay with giving boys more facilities than girls. This is now history.

In April the Obama administration and the Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights issued new guidance, rescinding the March 2005 policy that allowed these surveys.

The new guidelines return to the previous standard, under which schools will consider a number of factors, including athletic participation rates at the secondary school levels and interviews with coaches, to ensure they are following Title IX requirements.

As Vice President Biden <u>said</u> at the event, attended by AAUW representatives, "Making Title IX as strong as possible is a no-brainer." So...

Women's participation at the college level has increased more than 500 percent since Title IX's enactment. Better still, these gains have not come at the expense of men, whose athletic opportunities have also increased since Title IX's passage. Girls thrive when they participate in sports, and the benefit of playing sports stays with them for years to come.
