### Final 2010 Legislative Report

Of the 34 bills that AAUW CA either supported or was following, Governor Schwarzenegger signed 7, vetoed 6, and 20 did not pass out of both houses of the legislature. The Joint Resolution to request the U.S. Senate to Ratify CEDAW, the United Nations action on Civil Rights for women around the world was passed by both houses.

The bill that AAUW CA co-sponsored, SB 929, to prohibit cadmium in children's jewelry, was signed by the Governor. Notably, however, the Governor vetoed AB 1900 that would have required pregnant inmates to be restrained in the least restrictive way possible.
