Public Policy

We earned the vote 100 years ago. Now let's be sure our votes are counted!

We all know that voting for some of us may be trickier this year. Here are some hints to share with your friends and relatives (if they will let you).

- Register to vote or <u>update</u> your voter registration information at RegistertoVote.ca.gov/ This is critical if you have moved or changed your name.
- Check your voter registration info at VoterStatus.sos.ca.gov
- Sign up to track your ballot at WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov

Remember that AAUW is Political, not Partisan. There is a difference. Identified AAUW members can advocate for policies and legislative bills but not people running for office. But be sure you and your friends and relatives have the information above.

As you may know, the 2020 Tech Trek Camp was cancelled at UC, Davis because the university closed for the summer. We were all disappointed for the girls. Undaunted, we formed a committee to develop plans for our own mini-camp for the Chico and Paradise Trekkers. Thanks for the work of Sue Blizman, Pam Bodnar, Joan Cleveland, Kim Cross, Carol Holzgrafe, Mary Huntsinger, Jana Lawton, Jackie McClain, Lucia Ronan, Kathy Sweet, and Satsie Veith. This committee pulled together and learned how to use Zoom on computer so all eleven Trekkers could meet on June 23.

From this meeting the girls expressed a desire to build their own birdhouses.The committee located plans from Cornell University for the houses, then members purchased wood, screws, and paint for the girls to use. Jackie McClain helped us contact a local ornithologist, Sarah Blackstone, who educated the girls about birds. This event was held on July 25th . The girls and their parents were excited and thankful that they could learn about birds and build the birdhouses and that their daughters had not been forgotten. Another project may be planned as well.

This was a real team effort by Chico and Paradise members. The monies we raised for Tech Trek had already been forwarded to the AAUW-CA Special Projects Fund and could be only be disbursed in support of Tech Trek at UC, Davis. Thus, Paradise and Chico groups equally funded the purchases necessary for this project and the gift boxes we gave each girl. We are all proud of this effort which helped ease the loss the girls suffered by missing out on the Davis Camp experience.
