IBC Luncheon in Redding

Several of us attended the IBC luncheon in early February hosted by the Redding Branch (our newest IBC member!) and held at the McConnell Foundation's lovely facility in Redding.

Lynn Fritz, MA, was the speaker; she is a Kurak Tribal descendant and a Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist in private practice, specializing in spirituality, trauma/ PTSD, and Native America cultural practice.

Lynn certainly held our attention relating the travesties endured by not only her family, but by native Americans from the 1800s and the boarding school policies that forced family separation and cultural eradication.

Lynn talked about the many roles she is playing in overcoming the multigenerational trauma experienced by native Americans in northern California. Among them is her facilitation of First Nations/Native American cultural awareness seminars and providing psychotherapy for Native Americans, inclusive of Native spirituality and traditions, in northern California.

Lynn's presentation made for a hard act to follow. We, as members of the Paradise Branch, have lots of work to do in finding a speaker of Lynn Fritz's high interest and quality when we host the IBC spring luncheon next year.

This was the topic of the panel discussion presented by AAUW Chico Branch on March 27th. Our own Paradise Branch member, Sue Griffin, was one of the presenters.

The topic was the women who are incarcerated or immersed in the criminal justice system whether it is jail, probation, or prison. How do we empower marginalized women? What happens to women in custody and after they are released?

Panel members all had professional careers in corrections. Panelist CSUC Student Meaghan Odell is studying criminal justice and talked about her work experience at the 6th Street shelter. There was also a video interview with Lynn A., a former prisoner who shared how life in prison ultimately changed her life.
